Welcome to our School from the Headteacher



Welcome to Sutton Oak Church of England Primary School. Our aim is to provide a secure, safe and positive environment based on Christian values in which your child can reach their potential and become a responsible, trustworthy and caring member of society. General Information about the school...

Sutton Oak Church of England Primary School is a Local Authority Voluntary Controlled School with a Nursery Unit. We offer wraparound childcare from 8am to 6pm.

The school is situated on Goodban Street opposite All Saints Church. The school is set in two buildings. One houses the Nursery, Reception and KS1 classes and the other houses all KS2 classes. Internally our school is attractive and intellectually stimulating making a clear statement about our high standards.

We have an experienced and supporting Governing Body. Governors are appointed by the Church, the Local Authority, Parents and Staff.





Attendance and Punctuality...

It is very important to children's progress and in developing consistent routines that they attend school every day. It is hoped that parents will support the school in this regard and pupil attendance is monitored daily by our staff and Education Welfare Officer. Children should arrive on time for the start of the school day. Children who arrive late must report to the school office.

In the event of your child being absent parents are asked to inform school via telephone, website or school app. As part of our safeguarding procedures, school operates a 'First Response' system. This means that if your child is not in school when the register is taken and we have not been notified of the reason, we will contact parents/carers to ascertain the reason for absence.

The school can instruct the Education Welfare Service to issue a fixed penalty notice to parents of children who accumulate 10 sessions (5 days) of unauthorised absence within a 10-week period. This includes holidays taken during term time which have not been authorised by the Headteacher.

Requests for Holidays during Term Time...

Children need to be in school for all sessions, so that they can make the most progress possible. The Headteacher will not grant any leave of absence during term time unless 'exceptional circumstances' exist.

Any requests for leave of absence must be made in advance, using the Leave of Absence Request Form, which is available online or from the school office.

Pupils behave well in class and around the school. They try hard to demonstrate the school's values in everything they do.

Recognising Achievement

The Foundation Stage – Nursery & Reception

We have a large, welcoming nursery and reception providing a warm, caring environment to facilitate the best possible start to school life. Our nursery offers **30 hour funded places.** Your child can be admitted to nursery at the start of term following their third birthday. Breakfast club provision is also available for a small charge

Nursery and Reception children follow the Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum which builds upon their pre-school experiences and is based around four themes.

A Unique Child

Every child is a competent learner from birth who can be resilient, capable, confident and self-assured.

Positive Relationships

Children learn to be strong and independent from a base of loving and secure relationships with parents or a key person.

Enabling Environments

The environment plays a key role in supporting and extending children's development and learning.

Learning and Development

Children learn and develop in different ways and at different rates. All areas of learning and development are equally important and inter-connected. Children in the Foundation Stage learn by playing and exploring, being active, and through creative and critical thinking which takes place both indoors and outside.



Curriculum

At Sutton Oak C.E Primary we aim to offer a rich and engaging school experience in which children are willing partners in their own learning. We believe a curriculum should be broad and balanced but also provide our pupils with exciting and varied educational experiences.

English

Learning to read, write and speak with confidence are vital skills for our pupils to master during their time at Sutton Oak CE Primary School. We recognise that quality English is an essential tool for the development of all our children and particularly those that are 'disadvantaged' or have SEND.

Our English curriculum should engage, enthuse and excite children with the aim of developing confident, creative and inspired learners who value the importance of literacy skills now and later in life. We will attempt to instil a desire to be readers and writers for both pleasure and purpose.

Our whole school curriculum should be connected in a meaningful way, and it is our desire to develop reading, writing and listening skills across the foundation subjects. The teaching of English should provide opportunity to embed our Christian ethos throughout learning to show respect, perseverance and resilience.

Mathematics

We value a Maths curriculum that is creative and engaging. All children to have access to this curriculum and to make progress in lessons. Our children need to develop the necessary skills to make them "deep thinkers" acquiring maths skills that can be recalled quickly and transferred and applied in different contexts.

They need to be able to make rich connections across the areas of maths and use their knowledge in other subjects. Maths is the foundation for understanding the world and we want our children to know the purpose behind their learning and to apply their knowledge to their everyday lives.

Collective Worship & R.E

Collective Worship follows the principal teachings of the Church of England. We provide a daily act of worship which aims to combine Christian principles with spiritual and moral issues.

The teaching of Religious Education at Sutton Oak Church of England Primary School permeates all aspects of school life. Whilst an awareness of different faiths is taught, an emphasis on Christian traditions and teaching predominates.

Uniform

A school is often judged by the appearance and behaviour of its pupils; we are proud of our high standards and the personal pride that pupils take in their appearance. Parents have always been keen to support this view. The use of make-up, nail varnish, false nails & hair dye is not permitted.

The wearing of jewellery is also not allowed and long hair should be tied up.

Children will come into school wearing their kits on the day they are timetabled to do Physical Education.

Governors know the school well. They have a secure overview of the quality of education that pupils receive.



Information for Parents

Parents are informed of current events and school news via our school website, Facebook page, email and parent app.

Reports to parents are issued at the end of the summer term. Parents' evenings take place in October and March.

Personal Property

All property, which is lost, is normally returned immediately provided the items are clearly marked with your child's name. All other items are kept for one term. Pupils are responsible for all of their own possessions and school accepts no responsibility whatsoever for any loss or damage caused to them. We discourage children from bringing mobile phones and personal possessions into school.

No Smoking

Would parents/carers please note that the school operates a 'No Smoking' policy and remember this when they are on the school premises. This includes vaping. It is important that we set an example to the children. Thank you.

Dogs

Dogs should not be brought onto the school grounds.

Extra-Curricular Activities

The school endeavours to maintain an exciting programme of extracurricular activities. These include: Choir, Art, Cookery, Gymnastics, Archery, Fencing, Creative Writing, Football and Multi Skills. Throughout

the year the children visit various places of interest which, where possible, are linked to programmes of work being carried out in the classroom.

Community Activities

Adult and Family learning groups take place in school on a regular basis.

We have a group of active parents and staff who have formed the 'Friends of Sutton Oak' who organise Fundraising Events for the school to raise additional.



Inclusion

Children who are identified as having special educational needs or a disability (SEND) will be placed on the Special Needs Register, where their progress and attainment are carefully monitored. These difficulties may relate to physical, behavioural or learning needs. They will be supported within the school environment, and it is the aim of the school to provide all children with access to a broad and balanced curriculum to enable them to make good progress.

Additional support for children on the SEND register is provided with reference to the SEND Code of Practice. The Code describes how help for children with special educational needs in schools and early education settings should be made through a step-by-step or graduated approach.

The graduated approach recognises that children learn in different ways and can have different kinds or levels of SEND. So increasingly, step by step, specialist expertise can be brought in to help the school with the difficulties that a child may have. If there continues to be concerns regarding a child's progress then the school will consult with outside agencies for help and advice. The current Special Educational Needs and Disability policy is effective in identifying and addressing children with additional needs.

The school aims to keep parents and carers involved and informed as soon as a concern is identified. A child identified as having special educational needs will have regular reviews at which the parents/carers will be informed of their child's progress and invited to contribute their opinions. Parents/Carers will also be given copies of the review notes and, where applicable, copies of the SEND Support Plan. Leaders know pupils' families very well. Leaders work closely with external agencies to make sure that pupils and families get the timely support they need.
